









Review of recent careers events

Just before the Christmas break all of our students in Year 9 and Year 12 were able to take part in virtual careers events to continue our regular and on-going programme of career focused events that enhance our student's knowledge and understanding of the world of work.

Year 9 – Johnson & Johnson

Students had a virtual session on 11th December with one of the leading pharmaceutical companies in the world; Johnson & Johnson, who have major premises located in Maidenhead.

The main focus of this event was to present a detailed understanding and insight into a very wide variety of potential career paths available within pharmaceutical companies.

Many, particularly school age students, may assume these companies would just employ science focused positions; or for their manufacturing side; engineering positions. As it turns out there is a significant variety of career paths within the world of pharmaceuticals, which I am sure will come as an eye-opening surprise. The variety seemed endless, ranging from the expected science based roles to business, human resources, accounting and finance, IT and compliance and more. There is even space for creatives who work on printed materials, websites, brochure and company-wide publications etc.



Year 12 – Virtual NCS Experience

On 16th and 17th December our first year sixth form students had a two-day virtual event led by the National Citizens Services, which is a government sponsored organisation that has been working with schools for many years, with their summer and autumn offerings that happen during the school holidays. They offered three week residential courses available to all year 11 and 12's in schools around the country, with nominal/no charge (depending on need) to students, that included travel, accommodation, food and activities!

These courses addressed the need to develop personal skills, confidence and an understanding of civic engagement. Of course, during the current restrictions all interactions are virtual.

The event covered some of the most valued personal skills, with a presentation explaining the key to effective speaking and communication. The second day focused on team working and problem solving, which allowed teams to work on ideas promoting an understanding of a team's chosen charity and to present their resulting work to the members of N.C.S. running the session having had ongoing input from them to develop the ideas presented and suggestions for improvement.


