These skills are the foundation for exciting and progressive art projects that lead the boys into diverse and quality outcomes at KS4 and KS5. We aim to equip all students at KS3 with a confident attitude to work and expect all pupils to give their full effort to every task. We support students with their creative ideas and talents and encourage students to take creative risks. These qualities are the key development points for a successful, tenacious and progressive student.
